#### **Executive Summary**

Opportunity Alliance NV is a registered 501(c)(3). It is the state leader of the Prosperity Now (formerly CFED) assets and opportunities network and operates as a non-profit organization that provides tools and resources to public, private and non-profit

organizations, which strengthen the financial capability of their clients and stakeholders. Opportunity Alliance Nevada is also a strong advocate for policies that increase the financial health of Nevadans.

This year (our fourth year in operation) was a year of growth. Through generous grants from Schwab Bank, US Bank, Wells Fargo, Umpqua Bank, US Bank, Bank of America, the William G. McGowan Charitable Fund, and Prosperity Now organization, we were able to participate in the 2018 Prosperity Summit in Washington, DC, facilitate our Financial Coaching Institute training program licensed through Central New Mexico Community College, and complete a program with Crossroads of Nevada.



Opportunity Alliance Nevada was selected by Prosperity Now (formerly CFED) to be their Community Champion for Nevada and our Executive Director was chosen as "2017 Advocate of the Year" (award given in 2018). In addition, we were selected by the Consumer Financial Protection Bureau (CFPB) to be their 2018 Cohort coordinator for financial literacy/education throughout the United States. We invite you to join the collaboration as we change lives using evidence-based practices and metric-driven strategies to further the financial well-being of Nevadans.

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#### **Organization Description and Activities**

As a statewide entity that partners with organizations to serve Nevadans, Opportunity Alliance Nevada (OANV) seeks to integrate asset-building tools and resources into already established organizations and their programs to assist those organizations in helping their clients achieve long-term economic independence.

#### A Success Story

## My direct contribution to OANV mission for the financial improvement of local Nevadans.

Jack, a primary care patient saw the Healthy Money Habits flyer on a bulletin board inside one of the exam rooms. The patient contacted the Financial Wellness Program Manager directly to ask for help addressing his credit and student loan debt because they were causing him high stress. Since then, HOPES' Financial Wellness Program Manager has been meeting with Jack on a weekly basis. The program manager tailors the frequency of coaching sessions to a client's availability, and Jack chose weekly appointments in order to remain accountable. In the first coaching session, he was able to focus his thoughts and efforts and identify two overarching financial goals. His first goal was to address his student loans - which he stopped paying towards over 15 years ago. His second goal was to address his credit report. Jack was able to pinpoint the importance and urgency of both goals and decided to focus his time and energy into correcting his student loan situation. Since he stopped paying over 15 years ago, he was not aware of the status of his loans, or what company the debt had been sold to. He set a goal to find out the name of the company and obtain documents proving they owned the debt. Three weeks later, he was able to trace the company, obtained his promissory note along with documents proving debt ownership and set up a payment plan. After 15 years, Jack is now starting to work towards paying off his student loans. He continues to come to coaching sessions, now on a bi-monthly basis, and is now working on his second goal of addressing his credit. Jack states he wants to continue receiving financial coaching because he would like to reach a stress-free financial state.

#### **Financial Coaching Institute**

Completed three training classes in 2018 one in Reno and two in Las Vegas.

Financial Coaching Impact:

• 2 Central New Mexico Ingenuity, Inc. (CNM) trainers certified to conduct OANV trainings

• 62 participants – 55 completed training

• 6 Master Coach facilitated Network meetings

• 13 to 16 coach participants per meeting.

• 55 coaches completed training in 2018 bringing the total active coaches to 108 as of 12/7/2018—20 graduated 11/7/2018

• 15 coaches reported coaching 422 clients in 2018 with a total of 1,560 sessions and 152 achieved their goal(s).

• 2 members from UNLV who took the training in June of 2018 just received approval from UNLV to start a coaching program in 2019.

Chosen as Cohort for CFPB and lead train the trainer coordinator for their financial education cohorts across the nation.

• Presented "Your Money, Your Goals Train-the-Trainer" Webinar Series (Feb 8 & 15) with 33 attendees

In November of 2017, OA-NV received a second grant from the William G. McGowan Charitable Fund. The use of these funds was directed to continue *"From Poverty to Opportunity"* with Crossroads Reno.

The Crossroads Program is a collaboration between Washoe County Social Services

(WCSS) and Catholic Charities of Northern Nevada that began in January of 2011. The program provides a supportive living arrangement for men and women transitioning out of homelessness. Clients in the program are given a safe and caring environment to live in, along with wrap-around social services including drug and alcohol counseling, employment support, volunteer/work opportunities, and other tools to help them establish a new, more productive path in life. The goal of Crossroads is to prevent relapses into homelessness and substance abuse, and to reduce public costs associated with jail, hospital and other emergency services. The program has shown tremendous success with many community partners, and Washoe County estimates that Crossroads is saving the community about \$7 million per year.

The first session was completed March 22, 2018. The Second session was completed August 2, 2018 and third session December 4, 2018. These consisted of the "Getting Ahead in the Workplace" class followed with a Financial Empowerment program. This is a customized version of "Getting Ahead in a Just Getting-By World" that focuses on what it takes to be successful at work beyond just landing a job. It builds skills in:

- Thinking in the abstract while in chaos, overcoming the tyranny of the moment
- Listening skills
- Time management
- Planning backwards
- Importance/value of stability in daily life
- Building resources, including financial, emotional, mental, social, motivation, persistence, integrity, and trust.
- How to change, how to manage the stages of change
- Building income and wealth
- Work as a team

This program has successfully been tested in a national year-long study for the first phase of an evidence-based practice.

The journey at Crossroads has been a remarkable one in many ways. We completed 3 Getting Ahead classes and Financial Empowerment and Coaching for 31 participants in 2018.

1- The relationships were built over time and trust was developed with both investigators and facilitators.

2- The connection between learning how to navigate and building a resource simultaneously created powerful results.

3- Crossroads provided support and enthusiasm for the work and added an additional layer of leadership for the entire team.

4- Graduates of our 2017 class (McGowan 1) co-facilitated the classes which was an ingredient that led to leading by example and modeling the journey.

5- Adding Financial Empowerment at week 5 of Getting Ahead reinforced building a resource in real time while understanding the value of resource building as way to stability.

6- Providing on-going support and opportunity is key to stabilizing results.

Despite the fact the McGowan Foundation will no longer be a part of Northern Nevada, as a result of the progress made, Washoe County Human Services has stepped up to take over the program for 2019. Rest assured, OANV will assist if needed to continue the success of this program.

#### **Policy Committee**

The Policy Committee serves as a resource for public, private and non-profit stakeholders on the causes and effects of the financial challenges facing many Nevadans and on best practices for programs and strategies to increase economic opportunity and reduce financial insecurity in Nevada.

The Nevada Task Force on Financial Security was created by an Act of the 2017 Nevada state legislature to conduct a comprehensive examination of the economic stability of individuals and families in Nevada. The task force was working to propose policy and best practices to improve conditions in Nevada (SB118). Opportunity Alliance Nevada was chosen as the fiscal agent for the taskforce. Recommendations were completed in August 2018 and forwarded to the Legislative Counsel Bureau. A copy of these recommendations is available upon request. Final distribution of funds occurred October 31, 2018 and the remaining fund balance has been re-allocated to other policyrelated Opportunity Alliance Nevada events through the 2019 legislature.

The Policy Committee created the Education, Policy, Advocacy Network (EPA) to disseminate information to Nevadans regarding the Nevada legislature, more specifically the Nevada Financial Security Task Force (NFST) and the Nevada Affordable Housing Task Force created by the legislature. Presentation were held in Reno (November 15<sup>th</sup>) to begin planning for the 2019 legislature.

#### Youth Committee

The Youth Committee works in partnership with the Washoe County School District Volunteer Program, Junior Achievement and other organizations to integrate savings and financial education into the elementary school curriculum and to communicate information on the financial benefits of the State Treasurer's College Kick Start program.

During 2018, the committee achieved the following results:

- 1114 College KickStart accounts claimed between January and November 2018
- The committee is building memberships with the addition of Mark Pingle from the Hyack Group, Jared Busker from children's Advocacy Alliance, and Nancy Hamilton from Wells Fargo Bank.
- The committee is working with Angela Orr, WCSD Social Studies Program Coordinator, to identify and vet financial literacy programs and curriculum for inclusion in the WCSD's curriculum resources for teachers.
- The committee worked as a liaison between the University of Chicago and the WCSD to introduce their financial literacy teacher-training curriculum to Angela Orr's attention. This program will instruct teachers on how to teach financial literacy to students. The training is available on-line or in-person and participating teachers receive a stipend for their training time.

The committee continues to collaborate with the NV Treasurer's Office to bring awareness, information, and assistance to families about the College KickStart Accounts through community, school, and partner events.
